the East half of the South East quarter of Section Eleven, in Township thirty five North, of Range seven West, of the second principal Meridian, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Vincennes, Indiana containing Eighty Acres.

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Thomas H. Fifield

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
